OGQ is committed to bridging the gap between best athletes of India and those of other countries, thus helping Indian Athletes win Olympic Gold medals.</p> <p>The support to athletes from OGQ has been for coaches, training, nutrition, physiotherapists, amongst other things.</p> <p>Nineteen athletes supported by OGQ won medals in the 2018 Commonwealth Games (11 Golds, 4 Silver &amp; 4 Bronzes).</p>
